Latest Archival Committee Scanning Project - Soon To Be Up On Website!

The mission of the FHGF is the preservation of the legacy and history of Forest Hills Gardens. To accomplish this goal, we actively archive relevant documents and photographs both digitally and physically, with the assistance of professional archivists. Through the maintenance of our website (https://foresthillsgardensfoundation.org) we share the rich history of our neighborhood, and make it accessible to all. While both the archives and website are entirely funded through community outreach, the Foundation tackled a big project this year – the professional scanning and archiving of the complete set of the Gardens earliest newsletters, The Forest Hills Gardens Bulletins.

While these paper documents are now over 100 years old, they provide a unique picture into the very beginnings of our community. Ranging from 1915 to 1924 (227 newsletters in all!), they are a wonderful snapshot of the challenges and activities of The Gardens earliest residents. Projects such as these are costly but so vitally important in capturing our neighborhood's rich history and early days. Knowing how delicate the work would be, the Foundation worked closely with a professional scanning organization in Maryland, known for handling historical documents, where these aging newsletters were both digitized and cataloged page by page, assuring both their preservation and the ability for future generations' enjoyment. Community support and private donations have allowed the Foundation to tackle this important project – Thank You!

More work needs to be done. Website updates - adding more documents to our archives and improving search capabilities - will hopefully be started in the coming year. Working with professional certified archivists, the Foundation now has a helpful "FHGF Finding Aid to the Collection" and custom "FHGF Archive Collecting and Management Policy Guidelines" as well as training sessions for the Archive Committee and Board members. Working with the archivists at Cornell University and the Queens Library, as well as through thoughtful donations of materials by Gardens residents, we hope to be adding to our archives greatly in the coming years. It is important to note that as some long-time residents sell their homes, relatives have generously passed on valuable photographs and documents of our neighborhood. For example, the Esakof family recently donated items when preparing their Greenway North home for sale, resulting in wonderful additions to our collection.

In 1915, Will Phillip Hooper, a prominent Gardens resident at 84 Greenway South, compiled responses to the question: "Why We Have Chosen Forest Hills Gardens For Our Home", summarizing the reasons various families chose to purchase a home in the newly-created neighborhood of Forest Hills Gardens. The 28-page document chronicled the numerous and varied answers to this question from the 188 homeowners at that time. The FHG Foundation hopes to revisit this question and create an updated booklet to be added to the archives. It should be interesting to see if the reasons have changed and if so, how.
